The Insight tour of Mumbai starts from the Gateway of India. In fact, the Gateway of India happens to be a major landmark of the country itself, let alone the city. It came into being before air travel started in India. It was built in 1911 in order to commemorate the visit of Queen Mary and King George to India. After that, you would get to visit Marine Drive. This is a seafront boulevard. In fact, in the evening it is also referred to as the Queen's Necklace. A lot of this is because of its shape that resembles a U.
